Missouri Immunization Coalition, Back-to-School Toolkit

The Missouri Immunization Coalition (MIC) has launched a statewide Back-to-School campaign aimed at ensuring children and teens are ready for the upcoming school year with up-to-date vaccinations. The efforts started in July with ads on META, radio, Spotify, and Pandora, as well as targeted direct mailers and emails to remind parents and caregivers to schedule back-to-school immunizations and promote vaccines for children and teens in kindergarten through 12th grade.
